### **Steve Mechler, President**

Steve Mechler (ASLA) has served in numerous capacities on the board, currently serving as board President and also Chair of the Beautification Committee for the Lani-Kailua Outdoor Circle branch. He is a licensed landscape architect with a degree in environmental design. Steve is President of The Mechler Corporation, and for the past four decades, has designed landscapes for significant residential estates, commercial projects, and resorts in Hawai'i and throughout the Pacific rim.
