

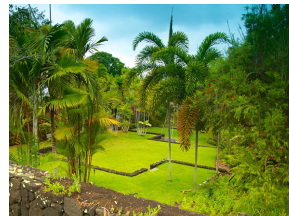

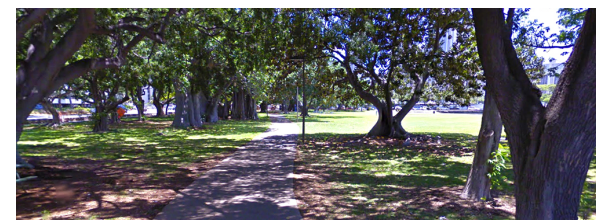

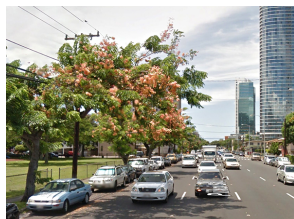

Planted monkeypod trees, 1912



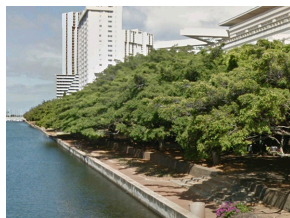
**Pi'ikoi Street, Honolulu:**

Planted monkeypod trees, 1960



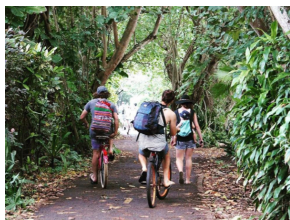
**Ala Wai, Honolulu:**

Renovated the grounds 1930, 1983



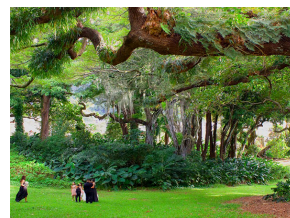
**Kawaiui Marsh, Kailua:** Formed

from demolition & restored gardens, 1913



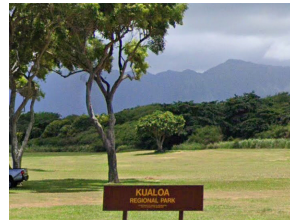
**Diamond Head Crater:** Instrumental in
